Patient care and Infection Prevention & Control (IPC) guidelines for twinned communities in Quebec

Residents of twinned communities in Quebec (Avignon Municipal Regional County, Listugui First Nation and Temiscouata Municipal Regional County) who travel into New Brunswick as part of same-day travel only with no overnight stays will not need to self-isolate when they enter New Brunswick.

New Brunswick residents who travel into, but not beyond, Avignon Municipal Regional County, Listugui First Nation and Temiscouata Municipal Regional County as part of same day travel with no overnight stays, will not need to self-isolate when they return to New Brunswick

IPC guidelines

Residents from the above twinned communities in Quebec seeking health care services at Horizon facilities will be placed under **droplet / contact precautions** regardless of same-day travel or overnight stay.

This will apply to the Emergency Department, Ambulatory Care services and hospitalized patients.

Residents of the Atlantic provinces who travel to the twinned communities in Quebec and have an **overnight stay** will also be placed under **droplet / contact precautions** when seeking health care services at Horizon.
