Bulletin #215 - COVID-19 - ID-IPC Update

October 21, 2022

As the COVID-19 virus continues to evolve, the IPC response is adapting and protocols are being deescalated in a practical manner with a focus on patient and health care worker safety.

Revised - IPC Guidance - Continuous Use of Face Masks/N95 Respirators and Eye Protection in Healthcare Settings During COVID-19 Pandemic – All Phases - Oct 5 2022

This document was revised to reflect the following:

- Outbreak units are considered high risk clinical areas
- Gasketed prescription eyewear has been identified as a appropriate PPE to be used in the clinical setting
- In Orange Phase:
 - In high risk clinical settings, eye protection is required when providing patient care as well as when providing indirect patient care <u>while</u> in patient room (such as meal delivery and Environmental Services).
 - In all other clinical and non-clinical settings, safety glasses are optional based on a Point of Care Risk Assessment.

Revised - IPC Guidance - Inpatient Passes/Leave of Absences During COVID-19 Pandemic – All Phases - Oct 5 2022

This document was updated and replaces Red and Orange Phase guidelines. The revised version advises that all patients returning from overnight, or day passes/leave of absences will be tested for COVID-19 upon their return and on days 3 and 7.

Revised - IPC Guidelines - Delivery of Electroconvulsive Therapy During COVID -19 - All Phases - Oct 5 2022

This document was revised to to align with the IPC Guidance: OR Theatres and OR Decision Pathway for Horizon Facilities in an Orange Phase document.





Revised - IPC Guidance - Ambulatory Care/Outpatient Services During COVID-19 - All Phases – Oct 7 2022

This document was updated to reflect the shortened incubation period of the Omicron Variant and the revised *Horizon Active Screening Tool*.

Revised - IPC Designated Support Person (DSP) Testing Guidelines - Oct 13 2022

This document was updated to relect the shortened incubation period of the Omicron Variant and the revised *Horizon Access to Facilities Active Screening Tool*.

The following DSPs require COVID-19 testing:

- A DSP with risk factors associated with providing support to a patient on a COVID-19 Outbreak Unit
- A DSP who has had close contact with a confirmed or probable case of COVID-19 meets the requirement for COVID 19 testing
