#### COVID-19 Patient Care and Infection Prevention & Control (IPC) Measures

The Infectious Disease and Infection, Prevention and Control (ID-IPC) COVID-19 Committee has updated the chart which outlines personal items that will be accepted into facilities. The update is in relation to clothing and is highlighted below.
