### **Orange Level reminders**

With all Horizon zones in the Orange Level of the provincial recovery plan (Vitalité's Zone 4 remains in the Red Level), it's important for staff and physicians to remain familiar with how each level of recovery impacts them and their patients/clients.

In the Orange Level, there is a "significant risk that COVID-19 is no longer under control in the province."

#### At Horizon, this means:

- There will be no visitors allowed in our hospitals. Some exceptions to these visitor restrictions are in place. Please see below.
- All New Brunswickers are discouraged from travelling outside of their zone and are restricted from visiting a Horizon hospital outside of their zone.

- Screening for patients and visitors should reflect the most up-to-date questions, which can be found here.

#### As always, all staff and physicians must:

- Self screen prior to leaving home for their shift. Screening questions are here.
- Swipe their ID badge upon entry to the facility.
- Practice frequent hand hygiene.
- Wear a mask.
- Maintain a physical distance of two metres.

#### Eye protection:

All health care workers (HCWs) who provide both hands-on patient care, as well as indirect patient care (meal delivery and housekeeping) in high-risk areas (COVID-19 units, ERs, ICUs, ORs and COVID-19 Assessments Centres) must wear















facial protection (face mask and eye protection) continuously, at all times in all areas of their workplace.

- The continuous use of facial protection is mandatory for all HCWs in these highrisk clinical settings.
- The continuous use of eye protection is optional for HCWs working in other clinical settings.

# Visitor guidelines and restrictions at Horizon hospitals and health care facilities

Visitation outside of the normally designated visiting hours may be considered.  One additional visitor (pastoral/spiritual care), per patient at the end of life, is permitted to visit to provide comfort to the patient, family and loved ones during the end of life period.
